Rotary Club of Clark Centennial Meeting Minutes 4 Novem 2008

President Joel Dungca brought the meeting to order at 12:30P.M.. Day Chairman Howard Kelley presented Dr. John Lloyd with a bag of assorted medications for the Center Clinic. Dr. Lloyd then took the podium and talked the Welsh Boys Choir who he been in correspondence with and stated that they have tentatively schedule the 1st of May 2009 as the date for their next benefit concert but he also stated that they are reluctant to return because of the lack of attendance during last years performance. Dr. Lloyd asked that a committee be formed to organize and advertise this year's program.

Secretary Bob Hartzell reported that the monthly reports were finished and ready to be submitted to the district and that the attendance figures for October were greatly improved. AG Jim Sebree stated that if the Board of Directors would like to make a resolution to allow any event where five or more members were present that it could be officially counted as a meeting if Rotary business was discussed. President Joel Dungca reported that IP George Watson had confirmed his position and that Rtn Carl Chiulli was confirmed as Incoming Vice-President. Charles Hoffman was nominated as Treasurer but Charles stated that perhaps Rtn Derek Hewett should hold the post and that he would be willing to assist him. Preparation for the medical mission is still ongoing, President Joel stated that he would request a mobile medical unit from Mabalacat Rotary. Charles Hoffman stated that he was in the process of getting a dentist signed on to assist so that it could be a Dental Mission as well. Charles Hoffman donated P10,000 to the Rotary Foundation to become a lifetime member. Mr. Gregory from the Philippine Youth Rugby Association donated \$8,000 to Bahay Bata and pledged to continue to donate. PP Victor Torres spoke with Governor Jessie Nicdao to communicate with other Rotary clubs to assist in organizing and sponsoring baseball teams. Carl Chiulli stated that there will soon be 26 boys at the Center and that work is ongoing on the computer room. PP Ron Nethercutt reported that he had purchased P19,000 worth of multi-vitamins and will coordinate with AG Jim Sebree to finish off the \$28,000 matching grant so that it can be closed out properly. Time is running out for planning the Christmas at Christmas Fund Raiser and the Annual Bahay Bata Christmas Party. President Joel declared that there will be an emergency meeting tomorrow 5 November at 2:00p.m. to move forward with plans for both events. Guest speaker Jojo Salunga spoke about problems and solutions for IT systems, namely viruses and how to stop them from infecting your computers. He suggested the use of AVG free software which detects viruses and deletes them before they can attack your computer. AG Jim Sebree won the raffle. The meeting was adjourned at 2:00p.m.

As we celebrate Rotary Foundation Month, we should all remember that The Rotary Foundation is our Foundation. It's here for us and because of us; it allows us to do more, to be more, and to bring more hope to the world. The responsibility for keeping our Foundation strong lies with each of us.
