Rotary Club of Clark Centennial Minutes of Meeting 7 Oct 08

President Joel Dungca called the meeting to order at 12:30p.m. Day Chairman Victor Torres ran the meeting.

Secretary's Report: Monthly reports for September have been submitted to AG Jim Sebree. Our September attendance percentage was an abysmal 68%. All members were reminded to pay their annual dues and to do their best to attend all meetings.

President's Time: Our Rotary Foundation is making plans to set up a medical mission for Bargangays Cuayan and Anunas. They are also trying to schedule a Little League Baseball tournament and we are inviting clubs to sponsor baseball teams who will play each other at Bahay Bata. There is a Rotary Cluster Project schedule for Friday 10 October dealing with the eradication of Dengue Fever through mosquito control. There will be a Cluster meeting at 6:00p.m. Wednesday, 8 October 2008 at Cottage Kitchen to finalize plans. PP Jim Sebree requested that our club do its best to participate. PP Bill Wright commented that there is a lot of used baseball gear at Bahay Bata that can be loaned to other teams in need of gear. PP Bruce MacTavish reported on the OSMG Car Auction that is tentatively scheduled for either 7 or 8 December but cautioned that we may receive a smaller contribution this year due to the world wide financial crisis.

PP Rey Pineda that the Magalang Hospital Project is moving forward with the support of Congressman Lazatin. We will coordinate getting unused equipment from ONA and transfer the equipment to Magalang. Dr. Tan is a former classmate of the Magalang Mayor and they will work closely together to make this project a reality. Ed Artis of Knightsbridge will assist in furnishing the remaining equipment required to furnish a 25 bed hospital. This will be a joint project with the Rotary Club of Magalang and will eventually turned completely over to them in time.

Carl Chuili gave a brief update on the status of the Rotary Foundation, Bahay Bata and the school. He requested that the Club Board of Directors take another look at changing the venue for our weekly meetings. He said that although he likes the Blue Boar Inn it is in fact a bar and is not an appropriate meeting place for Rotarians to attract new members, guests and guest speakers.
