Rotary Club of Clark Centennial Meeting Minutes 21 October 2008

President Joel Dungca brought the meeting to order at 12:30 PM. He thanked everyone for the large gathering of members and guests and stated that he hoped that we could build from this showing.

George Watson discussed the funding problems of coordinating a baseball league or tournament due to the lack of available equipment for many teams and the issue of transportation and meals for the players. PP Victor Torrez stated that the District Governor was behind this project and that perhaps we should ask other Rotary Clubs to sponsor teams from their locale.

Special Guest Hank Morrison was then introduced and proceeded to announce the success of the collection boxes located at Roadies Bar and Stargate. Owner Neil Maker was able to raise P30,000 which Hank presented to the Club. He asked that all members support this project by going to either one of the bars on a Monday, Wednesday or Friday from 5:00 – 6:00 P.M.

PP Rey Pineda announced that PP Nasser Pangilinan donated the podium in use today to our Club. He was given an ovation.

Lionel Claydon discussed the status of our two rugby teams and how they went to Manila last Saturday and played a French team and a British team and won both games. The Philippine National Rugby Union is going to bring the Philippine National Team to Bahay Bata to play our boys. PP Rey Pineda recommended that we register our team with the Philippine National Rugby Union.

PP Bruce McTavish announced that he received a \$1,000 donation for Bahay Bata from a fellow boxing referee.

Carl Chiulli invited everyone to attend the United Nations Day celebration at Bahay Bata this Friday 24 October beginning at 4:00P.M. and to try and go to the Touch Rugby Tournament in Subic on Saturday. He also stated that the boys were invited to a Halloween party at Xevera.

Honorary Rotarian Willie Rivera introduced Mr. Paul Vega who spoke about his Feeding Ministry for all street children and for the poor families of Angeles City.

Jim Dale introduced his guest Mr. Jay Stovall from Marine Corps Community Services in Iwakuni, Japan. He is the coordinator of the Toys for Tots Program in Japan and he brought many toys to be donated to Bahay Bata as well as pledging to continue to coordinate future projects such as supplying used clothing and baseball equipment.

Why do we have a Foundation? We have a Foundation because our Foundation lifts Rotary up. It lets every club and every district do the most it possibly can. It allows every one of us to be part of all of Rotary's work, and it brings that work to greater and greater heights.

As we celebrate Rotary Foundation Month, we should all remember that The Rotary Foundation is our Foundation. It's here for us and because of us; it allows us to do more, to be more, and to bring more hope to the world. The responsibility for keeping our Foundation strong lies with each of us.
